[REDACTED] hep C. in July 2014 pt enrolled in a trial at National Reseach Institute for hep C treatment : simeprevir plus sofosbuvir for 8 weeks vs 12 weeks; pt was in the 8 weeks treatment. pt responded well to treatment (viral undetectable on day 7), but viral load now 4-5million 4 weeks post treatment. pt also reports significant improvement of [REDACTED] energy level while on treatment "night and day difference" [REDACTED] pt insisted on referral to hepatologist for consultation and treatment since "the treatment clearly worked and is available" [REDACTED]

The treatment of persons with chronic hepatitis C (HCV) infection is rapidly evolving and changing. Newer HCV treatments are shorter in duration, more effective and safer. For these reasons, the Hepatology - Primary Care workgroup has recommended delaying the treatment of HCV infected individuals pending more effective treatment regimens coming on to the formulary at DHS. Your patient may eventually be a candidate for these newer and better HCV treatment options. Your care practices will be notified as changed care pathways for the treatment of HCV infected individuals are implemented at DHS.

Thank you for your patience in this matter. We are awaiting DHS approval to put the newer treatments on formulary, and will see HCV patients at that time.
